Role of Greek/Latin tutor

- Grammar-focused
- Vital elements of core teaching
- For non-beginners, most elements are *revision* this is *not* teaching from scratch
- Have a clear lesson plan, with timings, in mind, but be (a bit) flexible
- Put most time and emphasis on the 'thing to be taught that day'
- Going over homework
- Good use of board or projector

Marking

- Time taken to mark
- Amount of annotation
- Awarding a mark (high marks fine at beginners)
- Cheating
- Fair copy

Asking Questions and Encouragement

- Student adjustment schedule in grammar classes
- Ad hominem questions
- ENCOURAGEMENT

Things we have noticed over the years!

- Time-wasting by tutors (not intentional)
- Not hearing students (hard to fix)
- Pronunciation
- Different grammatical traditions and names of terms
- Students being naughty and/or arrogant
- The loud student
- The eager student
- Tutor extemporizing/innovating/overuse of grammar book
